HB 947 - Supplemental appropriations; State Fiscal Year July 1, 2009 - June 30, 2010

- BILL SUMMARY: This bill makes certain changes to the General Appropriations Act that was approved on May 11, 2009. It will provide appropriated sums of money for the State Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2010.

SB 355 - Health; provide that priority list of persons authorized to control the disposition of the remains of a deceased person

- BILL SUMMARY: This bill clarifies that if a deceased person dies while serving in any branch of the United States Armed Forces then whoever the deceased person designated on their United States Department of Defense Record of Emergency Data, DD Form 93, shall have second priority, after only a health care agent designated in an advance directive for health care, to direct disposition of the remains.

The bill provides that will or trust provisions relating to federal estate taxes should be construed in accordance with the law as it applied to decedents who died on December 1, 2009.

HB 948 - General appropriations; State Fiscal Year July 1, 2010 - June 30, 2011

- BILL SUMMARY: This bill provides appropriated sums of money for the State Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011. The funding will be used for the operation of the State government, its departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, institutions, and other agencies. Further, it provides funding for the university system, common schools, counties, municipalities, political subdivisions and for all other governmental activities, projects and undertakings authorized by law.

Children & Youth

HR 1713 - Health Departments; support system for Georgians with Disabilities; submit plan; request

- BILL SUMMARY: This urging resolution asks the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities, the Department of Community Health, and the Department of Human Services to provide the General Assembly with a strategic plan, developed in conjunction with the Olmstead coordinator. The plan should set priorities for home and community based services for people with developmental disabilities, physical disabilities, mental health issues, and traumatic brain injury and to support a multiyear funding commitment projecting the appropriations necessary to address the need for services for these Georgians.

Education

SB 239 - Education; mandatory attendance; provisions; require new residents in a local school system to enroll a child within 30 days

- BILL SUMMARY: Senate Bill 239 relates to attendance and enrollment policies within schools systems for youth between the ages of six and sixteen. Parents or guardians are allotted a 30 day grace period to enroll students into a school once they have moved into a new district. If a parent or guardian causes a child to accumulate 5 or more days of unexcused absences or any similar attendance policy violations, they will be held responsible. Such parents or guardians could be guilty of a misdemeanor, subject to monetary fines, imprisonment not to exceed 30 days, community service or any combination of.

SB 387 - Education; provide for career counseling/advisement for students in grades 6 through 12

- BILL SUMMARY: Senate Bill 387 related to the Georgia Student Finance Commission and their administration of the web based resource given for students in grades 6 through 12. This website gives the students counseling advisement, information to assist them in evaluating their academic skills and career interests as well as help students in grades 8 through 12 come up with a graduation plan.

SB 427 - Georgia Foundation for Public Education; establish; provide for membership, powers, duties, purpose

- BILL SUMMARY: Senate Bill 427 establishes a Georgia Foundation for Public Education for the purposes of soliciting and accepting money contributions, services or property for the purpose of supporting education excellence in Georgia. Georgia Academy for the Blind, Georgia School for the Deaf and Atlanta Area School for the Deaf, are specifically helped with this bill. However, the bill is not limited to only these institutions. The foundation will be governed by a board of directors composed between 5 to 15 members appointed by either State School Superintendent or State Board of Education. At least two members of the board shall represent the interests of the students who are blind or deaf.

SB 457 - Education; provide local board of education may act on petition for a conversion charter school for a high school cluster; referendum

- BILL SUMMARY: Senate Bill 457 relates to the approval or denial of charter petitions for conversion charter schools for a high school cluster. The high school cluster petition must receive at least 60% approval from the combined vote of the faculty and instructional staff of the high school cluster and parents or guardians of students to be approved for submitting to the local board.

SR 153 - Education Improvement Districts; provide creation and comprehensive regulation -CA

- BILL SUMMARY: Senate Resolution 153 proposes Constitutional Amendment to authorize the General Assembly to provide, by local law, for the creation of education improvement districts. The education improvement districts will be used to provide facilities or land for one or more public schools. Facilities or land may be used for construction of new school facilities, capitol improvements to existing school facilities, leasing school facilities or a combination.

HR 1736 - Secretary of State and Board of Regents; Georgia Capitol and State Museums; urge

- BILL SUMMARY: The purpose of House Resolution 1736 is to compel the Secretary of State and the Board of Regents to begin working toward creating a State Museum of History. Georgia being one of the original 13 American colonies established in 1733 has a very rich history. Unfortunately, with the amount of history this state possesses, Georgia is lacking a proper venue to preserve and teach our important heritage to the future generations of this state. The museum would encompass social, cultural, and political aspects of our history as well as artifacts that have been accumulated over time. This resolution encourages these agencies, including the General Assembly to begin planning a place to display the legacy of Georgia properly.

Higher Education

SB 496 - Education; establish the HOPE needs based scholarship; definition; provide for eligibility requirements; scholarship amounts

- BILL SUMMARY: Senate Bill 496 would create a need based college grant for students attending postsecondary institutions whose families combined income has rendered the student eligible for federal educational assistance funds awarded under the federal Pell Grant Program. The Georgia Student Finance Commission will determine which students are eligible for this grant aiming to serve the neediest students. This grant can be applied to any cost acquired from attending a public postsecondary institution.

However, students that receive this need based grant must meet the current provisions set in place for obtaining the HOPE scholarship including proper residency requirements and enrollment standards. Students are eligible for this grant until they receive a baccalaureate degree or have completed a total of 190 quarter or 127 semester hours.

The grant is subject to appropriations by the General Assembly. The Georgia Student Finance Commission will decide the award amount and can be based upon a sliding scale determined by income. If there is not enough money to be appropriated for the need based grant, then the award may be reduced or eliminated.

SB 161 - Insurance; require certain coverage for autism spectrum disorders; provide definitions

- BILL SUMMARY: SB 161 provides for the establishment of a state-wide task force to develop a plan for education and services regarding autism. It is composed of 23 members representing the various stake holders. The task force shall conclude their meetings by December 31, 2011 and report their findings to the General Assembly at the convening of the 2012 Legislative Session.

SB 310 - Insurance; pharmacy benefits managers; regulation and licensure

- BILL SUMMARY: SB 310 provides that Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBM's) shall be regulated and licensed by the Insurance Commissioner's Office. Further, this bill provides for regulation and licensure of multiple employer self-insured health plans by the Commissioner of Insurance.

SB 316 - Medicare Supplemental; make available to persons under age 65 who qualify for Medicare due to disability or end-stage renal disease

- BILL SUMMARY: SB 316 extends Medigap insurance policies to everyone that qualifies for Medicare. Currently, these policies are only available to individuals over 65 years of age.

SB 411 - "Healthy Georgians Act of 2010"; provide exemptions from certain unfair trade practices for certain wellness and health promotion programs

- BILL SUMMARY: SB 411 is the "Healthy Georgians Act of 2010". It will allow health insurers to offer incentives to their policy holders to improve their overall health. Under current law, such incentive programs are considered unfair trade practices.

SB 481 - Insurance; accident and sickness policies; termination of coverage of surviving spouse/break in marital relationship; revise provisions

- BILL SUMMARY: SB 481 standardizes to 90 days as the amount of time after the death or entry of a valid divorce decree that a surviving or divorced spouse has to make application to a health insurance company to continue coverage to 90 days after the death or entry of a valid divorce decree.

SB 235 - Microchip Consent Act of 2009; prohibit requiring a person to be implanted with a microchip

- BILL SUMMARY: This bill prohibits requiring someone to be implanted with a microchip. The bill includes definitions of 'implant,' 'microchip,' 'person,' and 'require.' 'Person,' for purposes of this bill is any individual, irrespective of age, legal status, or legal capacity. The penalty for violation of this Code section is a misdemeanor. Further, a person required to have a microchip implanted in violation of this Code section may file a civil action for damages. The bill provides that voluntary implantation may only be performed by a physician and shall be regulated by the Georgia Composite Medical Board.

HR 1146 - General Assembly; citizens not obligated to comply with appointed "czar"; declare

- BILL SUMMARY: This Resolution encourages the federal executive branch to re-consider unconstitutionally empowering "czars" with policy, rules, or any other legal power. As a result, this legislation will reaffirm that the state legislature will demand that the United States Constitution be followed by the federal branch pertaining to czars. Appointments by a President with out Senate confirmation are not binding on this state or on the citizens.

SB 354 - Public Roads; further declare authority of counties/municipalities to remove roads from their systems when removal is in best public interest

SB 519 - Motor Vehicles; motorized cart; modify definition; change hours of operation; provide local governments decide operators be licensed

- BILL SUMMARY: Amends Georgia code (40-1-1) relating to motorized carts. This bill states that carts may be operated on streets a half hour before sunrise and a half hour after sunset unless the local government or commissioner of public safety says the carts may be operated during the hours between sunset and sunrise. If the carts are allowed to operate during said hours they must have two headlights, two tail lamps, two brake lights, four turn signal lamps (two in front, two in rear), a center high mount stop lamp (CHMSL), and a windshield.

SB 520 - Transportation Dept.; provide for an Intermodal Division within the department
